Basic Techniques for Children's Lit. Writers I & II

Writers I: (3 weeks) Mon., Sep. 13, 20, 27, 7–9 p.m., \$30**

Writers I & II: (6 weeks) Mon., Sep. 13, 20, 27, Oct. 4, 11, 18, 7–9 p.m., \$55** ART-F02

Adults 16 and up. Writers I introduces essential techniques for writing children's literature. It will cover characterization, point of view, and descriptive detailing. Learn how to create realistic and unique characters, set up visual settings and sensory images. Writers II pre-requisite is Writers I. Learn about conflict, climax, resolution, and the essentials of structuring story development. Other techniques will be explained and explored: "Show, Don't Tell," dialog and internal dialog and tightening. Course includes instruction, writing time, and discussion. Optional but recommended text: The Writer's Guide to Crafting Stories for Children by Nancy Lamb (\$12 to Arts Center at first class). 
