Musikgarten is an educational program for children and their families. Music is the tool used to stimulate children's minds and bodies, to create thinking, feeling and expressive children. Children ages birth to 5 explore pitch, rhythm, and expression in music using folk songs from around the world. Bouncing, rocking, dancing, singing, rhythm instruments, storytelling, circle dances, creative movement, and lots of laughter are all part of the curriculum. Classes are held at the Arts Center of St. Peter, 315 South Minnesota Avenue, lower level. A caregiver should attend and participate at each class.

Precious Metal Clay Workshops

Precious Metal clay is a revolutionary new art form taking the jewelry making world by storm. PMC represents a dramatic development in working with precious metals. PMC consists of microscopic particles of silver or gold suspended in an organic binder to create a pliable material with a consistency similar to that of modeling clay. PMC can be worked with fingers and simple tools to create a vast range of forms and surfaces that are unobtainable or laborious using traditional techniques. When it is heated to a high temperature, the binder burns away and the metal particles fuse to form solid metal that can be sanded, soldered, colored and polished like conventional materials. PMC may be hallmarked and will assay as .999 pure.
